Current Affairs Related to 6 July 2026

- ◆ The Ministry of Corporate Affairs has launched the 'Corporate Mitra Scheme 2026' with the aim of strengthening the country's Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector. This scheme was announced in the Union Budget 2026-27. Its primary objective is to train para-professionals capable of assisting MSME units in critical areas such as compliance, accounting, taxation, financial guidance, and corporate governance. This initiative will enhance the operational efficiency of small enterprises while simultaneously creating new employment and skill development opportunities for the youth.
- ◆ Amid the Russia-Ukraine conflict, the importance of long-range weapons continues to grow. In this context, the 'FP-5 Flamingo'—developed by Ukraine—has garnered attention as a state-of-the-art, ground-launched unmanned cruise missile system. Reports indicate that this missile system was used to attack the 'Federal Research and Production Center Titan-Barrikady' in Volgograd, Russia. This is a key defense industry facility where launchers for several of Russia's strategic missile systems and heavy weaponry are manufactured.
- ◆ Achieving a significant milestone in environmental conservation, Indian scientists have identified a new species of bacteria named *Brachybacterium netajii*. This bacterium was isolated from the Hooghly River in West Bengal, an area where pollution levels are high due to industrial waste. Through polyphasic taxonomic analysis, scientists designated this new species as *Brachybacterium netajii* sp. nov. The species has been named in honor of the great freedom fighter Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose. The most significant characteristic of *Brachybacterium netajii* is its bioremediation capability.
- ◆ India and Seychelles have further strengthened their bilateral ties, taking cooperation in maritime security, defense, and the economy to new heights. During Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Seychelles, both nations announced several significant agreements and collaborative initiatives. The visit coincided with the celebrations of Seychelles' 50th Independence Day and the completion of 50 years of diplomatic relations between India and Seychelles.
- ◆ As a significant step towards tiger conservation in India, the sixth cycle of the All India Tiger Estimation 2026 commenced in January 2026. This nationwide survey is conducted to scientifically assess tiger populations, the condition of their habitats, and biodiversity. The process utilizes field surveys, camera traps, and genetic sampling. Forest department personnel, volunteers, and wildlife experts from across the country are participating in this comprehensive exercise. The final report is expected to be released in 2027.
- ◆ The Indian Coast Guard achieved a significant milestone in strengthening India's maritime security. The new-generation Fast Patrol Vessel, ICGS Akshay, was formally inducted into the Indian Coast Guard at Goa Shipyard Limited in Vasco, Goa. This 52-meter-long indigenous vessel is the fourth in the 'Adamyia' class and was developed under the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' (Self-Reliant India) and 'Make in India' initiatives. Its objective is to enhance the effectiveness of coastal security, maritime surveillance, and law enforcement operations.
- ◆ The Odisha government has launched the 'Go East' initiative aimed at accelerating industrial investment and balanced regional development within the state. Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi announced this ambitious initiative during a meeting of the CII Eastern Region Council held in Bhubaneswar. The initiative seeks to attract investment not only to Odisha but also to the entire Eastern and North-Eastern regions of India, while establishing a fast, transparent, and accessible system for industries.
- ◆ The global medical device sector is evolving rapidly, and governments across various nations are emphasizing the need to make regulatory frameworks more effective, transparent, and safe. In 2026, India, the European Union, the United Kingdom, and the United States implemented or proposed several significant regulatory changes regarding medical devices. These reforms aim to simplify the licensing process, strengthen quality standards, enhance product traceability, and ensure patient safety.



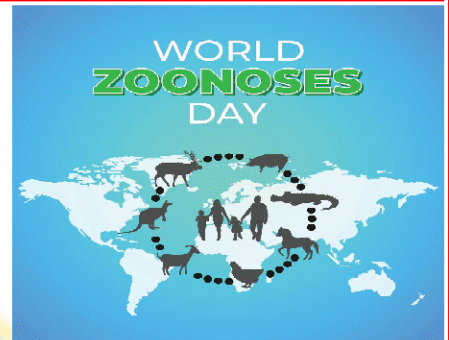

9. Which country has recently officially become the UNESCO World Heritage capital with 61 protected sites?

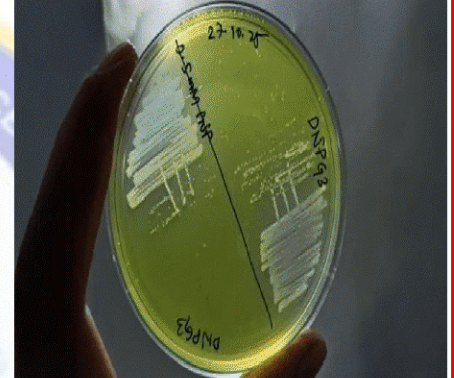
