Current Affairs Related to 13 July 2026

- ◆ **To strengthen regional air connectivity in India, the Central Government has approved the revised UDAN scheme** for the period from the 2026-27 fiscal year to 2035-36. Under this scheme, special emphasis will be placed on connecting the country's remote and underdeveloped areas with better air services. The government believes that this initiative will not only provide affordable air travel to passengers but also boost regional economic development and tourism. The revised UDAN scheme will be implemented for ten years, with the Central Government making a total budgetary provision of ₹28,840 crore for it.
- ◆ **'Jalbhara Sandesh,' a famous sweet from Chandannagar in West Bengal's Hooghly district, has been granted the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.** This traditional Bengali sweet, which dates back over 220 years, has now officially received recognition for its regional identity and cultural heritage. The GI tag will safeguard the authenticity of this unique sweet and provide new recognition to Chandannagar's confectionery tradition at both national and international levels. A Geographical Indication is a sign that links a product's specific quality, reputation, or distinctiveness to its geographical origin.
- ◆ **In a significant move to further strengthen national security, the Ministry of Home Affairs has designated 23 Pakistan-based terrorists as 'terrorists' under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967.** All these individuals are reported to be linked to banned terrorist organizations such as Jaish-e-Mohammed and Lashkar-e-Taiba. The objective of this action is to effectively curb terror financing, infiltration, and terrorist networks. The Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, is India's primary counter-terrorism legislation.
- ◆ **India has achieved a significant milestone towards self-reliance in the manufacturing and logistics sectors by unveiling its first EXIM-grade shipping container.** Union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways Sarbananda Sonowal unveiled this container at an event held at the Maersk Concor Inland Container Depot in Dadri, Uttar Pradesh. The container was manufactured by the DCM Shriram Group and developed in accordance with international standards.
- ◆ **Prioritizing the health and safety of students, the Maharashtra government has announced a ban on the sale of so-called energy drinks (including those containing stimulants) and other intoxicating substances within a 500-meter radius of all schools across the state.** Food and Drug Administration Minister Narhari Zirwal announced this decision in the Legislative Assembly during the monsoon session. The move aims to protect children and adolescents from the potential health risks associated with such products and to ensure a safe environment around schools. In accordance with government directives, the Food and Drug Administration will take immediate action against shopkeepers selling these prohibited products within the 500-meter zone.
- ◆ **Achieving a significant milestone in the field of quantum physics, scientists at the University of Innsbruck in Austria have successfully created a new and rare quantum form of matter known as a "fractional Fermi sea."** This achievement involved cooling approximately 70,000 cesium atoms to temperatures in the nanokelvin range and confining them within one-dimensional tubes. Through controlled interactions, the scientists generated this new quantum state, a development considered a major breakthrough in understanding the behavior of matter.
- ◆ **Scientists have declared a historic banyan tree in Munger, Bihar, to be the world's oldest accurately dated banyan tree.** Based on high-precision radiocarbon dating techniques, its age has been estimated at approximately 700 years. This achievement is significant not only for India's natural heritage but also represents a major success in scientific research regarding the age determination of tropical trees. The research was published in the international journal *Frontiers in Forests and Global Change* in April 2024. This massive banyan tree is located within the Indian Tobacco Company complex in Munger.
- ◆ **The QS World University Rankings 2027 have been published, featuring a remarkable performance by Indian higher education institutions.** This year, the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi secured the 118th global rank, emerging as the highest-ranked institution in India. This achievement is not only significant for IIT Delhi but also reflects the growing global influence of Indian higher education.

4. Scientists from which country recently achieved a significant milestone in biomedical research by developing a lab-grown 'placenta-on-a-chip' technology?

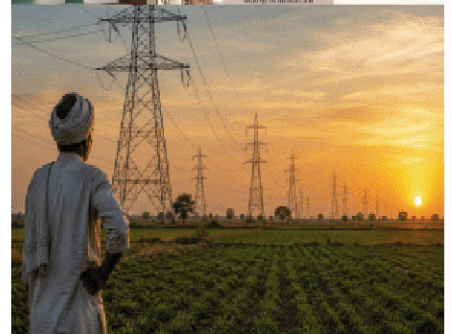
